The four codes include -

- 1) Code on Wages
- 2) Code on Industrial Relations
- 3) Code on Social Security and
- 4) Code on Safety, Health & Working Conditions.

Besides codification, the Ministry of Labour& Employment (MoLE) aims to undertake number of initiatives for bringing transparency and accountability in enforcement of Labour Laws, which includes nationalise the Labour Laws as well as activation of UAN (Universal Account Number).
